Supplies we will accept for donation include:

- Quilter's 100 percent cotton, larger than a fat quarter or pre-cuts. (No scraps.)
- Preferred Fabric (100% cotton, fleece, flannel)
- Garment fabrics 1 yard or larger, especially wool, linen, corduroy, or cottons.
- Buttons, zippers, pins, or trims, new in package only.
- Any scissors, rotary cutters or marking tools.
- Any quilting rulers
- Cotton Batting, Polyfil, Stabilizer, Interfacing
- New Thread, Yarn or Embroidery Floss
- Unopened packages of Velcro or Elastic
- Sewing Machine Needles in Labeled Container
- Crochet Hooks or Knitting Needles
- Irons, Ironing Boards
- Working Sewing Machines (not in cabinets)
- Quilt Tops
- Storage Bins

Items we do NOT accept:

- Items with an Odor (Mildew, Smoke)
- Sewing Machines in Cabinets
- Hand Quilting Frames
- Magazines
- Books published before 2015
- Used Clothing Patterns

Items we are temporarily NOT accepting:

- Polyester knits or silky/satiny fabrics
- Loose buttons, pins and zippers
- Partial skeins of yarn, thread

Sew4Service was founded in 2021 by Lucy Kulbago to connect creative makers with people and pets in need through sewing, quilting, crocheting, and knitting. What began as a community effort to share handmade items has grown into a mission focused on upcycling donated textiles—transforming fabric, yarn, and supplies that might otherwise go to waste into new materials for creative reuse. These materials are sold at affordable prices through The Fabric Stash Store, helping fund Sew4Service’s programs and providing resources for makers. Volunteers and community members then use these upcycled materials to create charity items that are distributed to individuals and organizations in need, combining sustainability, creativity, and compassion in every stitch.
